And building and maintaining a good road network is a significant cost to any operation, so why not protect that investment with a good road maintenance program. Come join Hugh Hambly and crew as they provide some hands-on tips and best practices for maintaining your road with a grader, see for yourself the benefits of compacting your road surface, and recent trials with a new soil stabilizing product.

Just down the road, there are some interesting research trials that are focused on encouraging spruce and pine regeneration through a novel stand intervention process: by removing the balsam fir understory with a front-end mounted mowing machine. Come see the machine in action as these sites will no doubt generate lots of discussion.

Naturally, there's more in store, but it wouldn't be a field trip without a few surprises, so plan to attend on the 8th.
